

RE: Agreement for Limitation of Appraised Value of Property for School District Maintenance and Operation Taxes by and between DEGS Wind I, LLC and Lyford Independent School District dated December 12, 2011 (known as Lyford ISD Agreement)

Dear Mr. Garcia

Pursuant to Section 8.4 of the Lyford ISD Agreement, this letter shall serve as written notice that DEGS Wind I, LLC, as the original applicant under the Lyford ISD Agreement, has fully assigned the Lyford ISD Agreement to Los Vientos Windpower IA, LLC and Los Vientos Windpower IB, LLC. Los Vientos Windpower IA, LLC and Los Vientos Windpower IB, LLC will be known respectively as Los Vientos IA and Los Vientos IB.

The Assignment fully assigns the Lyford ISD Agreement to Los Vientos IA and Los Vientos IB to the fullest extent necessary to allow Los Vientos IA and Los Vientos IB to utilize the full limitation on appraised value and tax limitation amount granted under the Lyford ISD Agreement on the qualified investment and qualified property constructed in the reinvestment zone owned by Los Vientos IA and Los Vientos IB. With the assignment Los Vientos IA and Los Vientos IB has retained all rights, titles and interests in the Lyford ISD Agreement to allow Los Vientos IA and Los Vientos IB utilize the full limitation on appraised value and tax limitation amount granted under the Lyford ISD Agreement.

The allocable share of the Lyford ISD Agreement limitation on appraised value and tax limitation amount shall be 48.77% (rounded) to Los Vientos IA and 51.23% (rounded) to Los Vientos IB of the \$10 million in years 3 through 10. The allocable share of the \$10 million limitation shall be \$4,876,898 for Los Vientos IA and \$5,123,102 for Los Vientos IB.

As part of the assignment, Los Vientos IA and Los Vientos IB has accepted the full assignment of the qualified property and assumed all of the conditions and obligations as the original applicant, DEGS Wind I, LLC, under the Lyford ISD Agreement.

This letter shall also serve as a notice stating the company name, tax identification number and contact information. The following information should be used for Los Vientos IA and Los Vientos IB.
