### Section 3: FPL Energy's Taylor County Investment

For this analysis, TXP has focused on calculating the combined economic impact of FPL Energy's energy investment in Taylor County (Blackwell C.I.S.D. and Jim Ned C.I.S.D.). In part, the process entails combining FPL Energy's total regional employment and payroll estimates with industry output ratios. The reason for combining both school district investments is that the project is really one large investment that happens to span multiple districts. The economic assumptions underlying the analysis are summarized in the tables below. As noted in the introduction, the financial impact of the requested property value limitation on the finances of Jim Ned C.I.S.D. is addressed in a separate report.
