Dear Mr. Baugh,

In an email dated July 3, 2018 the Comptroller asked for the following corrections and additional information;

1. Tab 2: Digital version did not have copy of check
Response: A digital copy of the application fee check is attached as supplemental information.
2. Section 5: Verify as it differs from Application 1266 (IP Aragorn, LLC)
Response: Applicant believes the answers in Section 5 and the information in Tab 3 are correct.
3. Tab 7: Will there be a Project substation and O&M for both Application 1266 and 1267 (IP Titan and IP Aragorn)? Note that if there is a Project substation and O&M for IP Titan, LLC (App 1267) you will need to update the Map (Tab 11) to show the location inside App 1267's project boundary. Furthermore, please list the qualified property that only applies to Application 1267.
As explained in a meeting with the Comptroller on July 10th, there is a project substation and O&M building for both IP Aragorn and IP Titan. A revised approximate project boundary map for IP Titan is attached. The description of qualified property in this application is accurate.
4. Tab 12: The "Request for Waiver of Job Creation Requirement" letter must state the industry standard for the number of employees reasonably necessary for the operation of the facility. This must include either a clearly stated industry standard number of jobs or a testable calculation; for example, a specific number of jobs per a specific number of solar panels/MW.
Response: A revised job waiver letter is attached with a testable calculation.

5. Section 14 Question 7a. The wages for 7a (all industries) must be set to “total all” ownership. Under Tab 13, please provide a new “Quarterly Employment and Wages (QCEW)” reflecting the change to “total all.”

Response: A revised wage rate calculation is attached.

- a. As there is no average weekly wage for manufacturing jobs in the county figure available, please insert “N/A” in 7.b.

Response: A text box with N/A is inserted in 7.b.

6. Schedule D: Please provide annual incentive as a percentage.

Response: As noted in our meeting on July 10th, applicant has asked the county and hospital district for a 90% abatement for ten years. This is stated in the “Additional Information” box at the bottom of the form.

7. Maps: Based on the original included map, we are unable to determine the project area that applies only to application 1267. This application should only reference the project area that resides in Culberson County-Allamoore ISD. Also, with the new map, please provide streets or landmarks or highways (we aren’t able to determine the exact location of the project boundary) and provide a map legend.

Response: Attached is a revised map showing the approximate project boundary for this application. Also attached is a map from the Permanent University Fund showing Block 46 in relation to two highways. All of this project is in Culberson County-Allamoore ISD.

The following additional information is also included as amendments to the application. Tab 9 is amended to state that all of the sections in Block 46 that are in the reinvestment zone are University Lands. Tab 16 is amended to state that all of the sections in Block 46 that are in the reinvestment zone are University Lands.

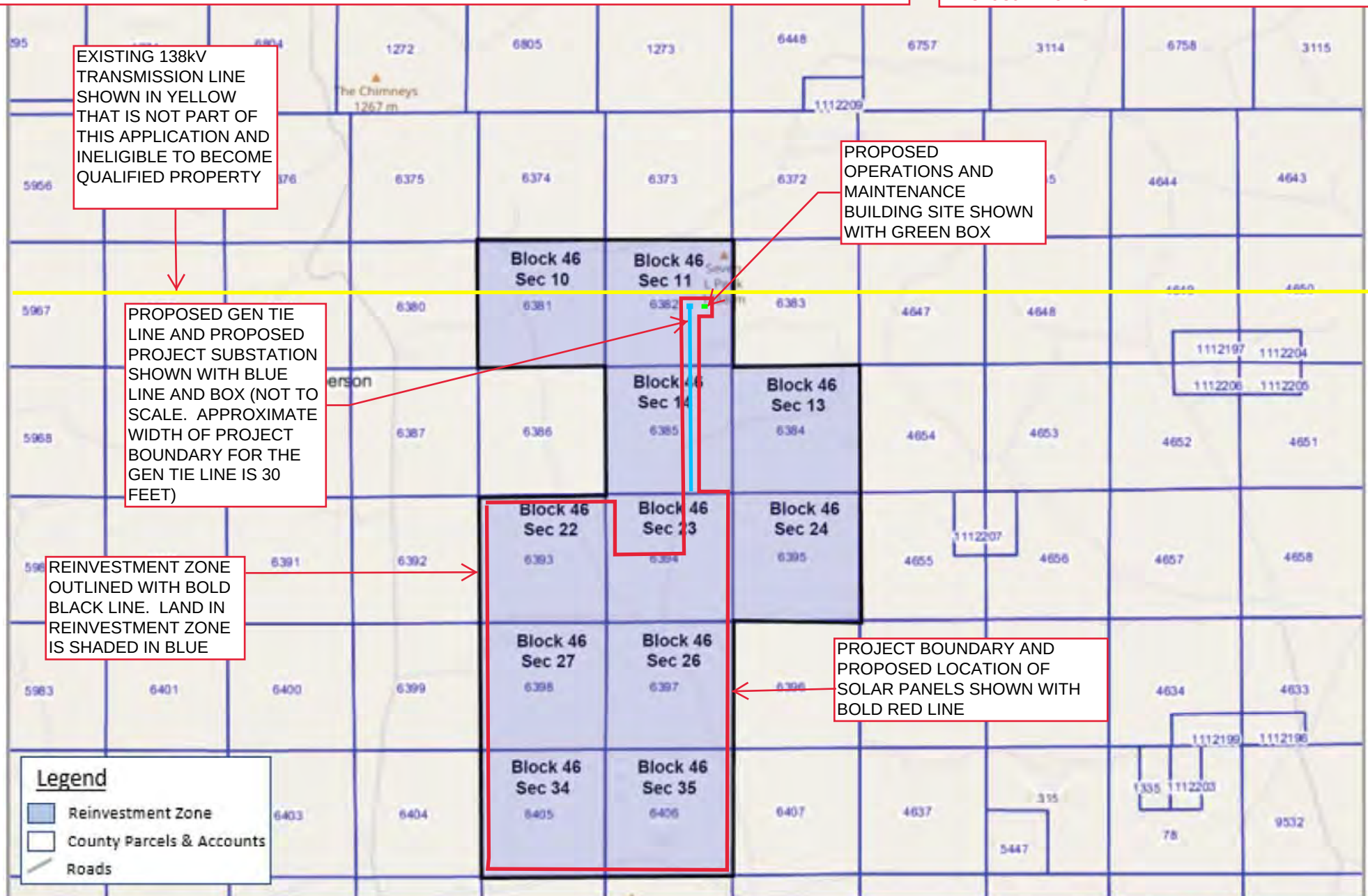

Re: Chapter 313 Job Waiver Request

Dear Mr. Baugh,

IP Titan, LLC requests that the Culberson County - Allamoore Independent School District's Board of Trustees waive the job requirement provision as allowed by Section 313.025(f-1) of the Tax Code. This waiver would be based on the school district's board findings that the jobs creation requirement exceeds the industry standard for the number of employees reasonably necessary for the operation of the facility of the property owner that is described in the application.

IP Titan, LLC requests that the Culberson County - Allamoore Independent School District make such a finding and waive the job creation requirement for 10 permanent jobs. In line with industry standards for job requirements, IP Titan, LLC has committed to create 2 total jobs for the project, which will be in Culberson County - Allamoore ISD.

Solar projects create a large number of full and part-time, but temporary jobs during the construction phase of the project but require a relatively small number of highly skilled technicians to operate and maintain the project after commercial operation commences. A number of our solar clients have advised that the industry standard for staffing new solar projects is one employee for every 150 megawatts AC of capacity.

The number of jobs specified in this application is in line with the industry standards for a solar farm of this scope and size. This is evidenced by previously filed limitation agreement applications by solar developers who also requested a

waiver of the job requirements. In addition, there is publicly available educational material and other documentation that also suggest that IP Titan has the appropriate number of jobs for this project.

**AN ORDER OF THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF CULBERSON COUNTY, TEXAS DESIGNATING
CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY WITHIN CULBERSON COUNTY AS A REINVESTMENT ZONE UNDER
CHAPTER 312 OF THE TEXAS TAX CODE**

WHEREAS in accordance with Chapter 312 of the Texas Tax Code and the Guidelines and Criteria for Granting Tax Abatements in Reinvestment Zones (hereinafter "the Guidelines"), the Commissioners Court of Culberson County has conducted a public hearing on the designation of certain real property within Culberson County, more particularly described as the Culberson County Reinvestment Zone Number 1 with property descriptions contained in Exhibit "A", (hereinafter "the property") as a reinvestment zone under the said chapter; and

WHEREAS Chapter 312 and the Guidelines require that certain findings of fact be entered in order to designate a reinvestment zone;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Commissioners Court of Culberson County, Texas finds as follows with regard to the property:

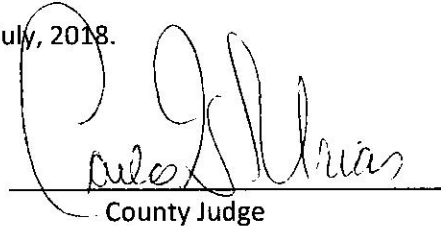
- a) That the applicants have met their burden and demonstrated to this body that the area will reasonably likely as a result of the designation to contribute to the retention or expansion of primary employment or to attract major investment in the zone that would be a benefit to the property and that would contribute to the economic development of Culberson County,
- b) That the improvements sought are feasible and practical.
- c) That the proposed improvements sought will be a benefit to the property and to Culberson County after the expiration of an agreement entered into under V.T.C.A., Tax Code, Section 312.204.

WHEREAS the Commissioners Court of Culberson County has made the findings of fact necessary to designate the property as a reinvestment zone; and

WHEREAS the Commissioners Court of Culberson County believes such designation to be advantageous to the inhabitants of Culberson County;

It is therefore ORDERED by the Commissioners Court of Culberson County that the said real property within Culberson County described in Exhibit A is hereby designated as a reinvestment zone under Chapter 312 of the Texas Tax Code.

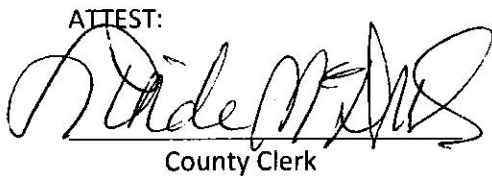
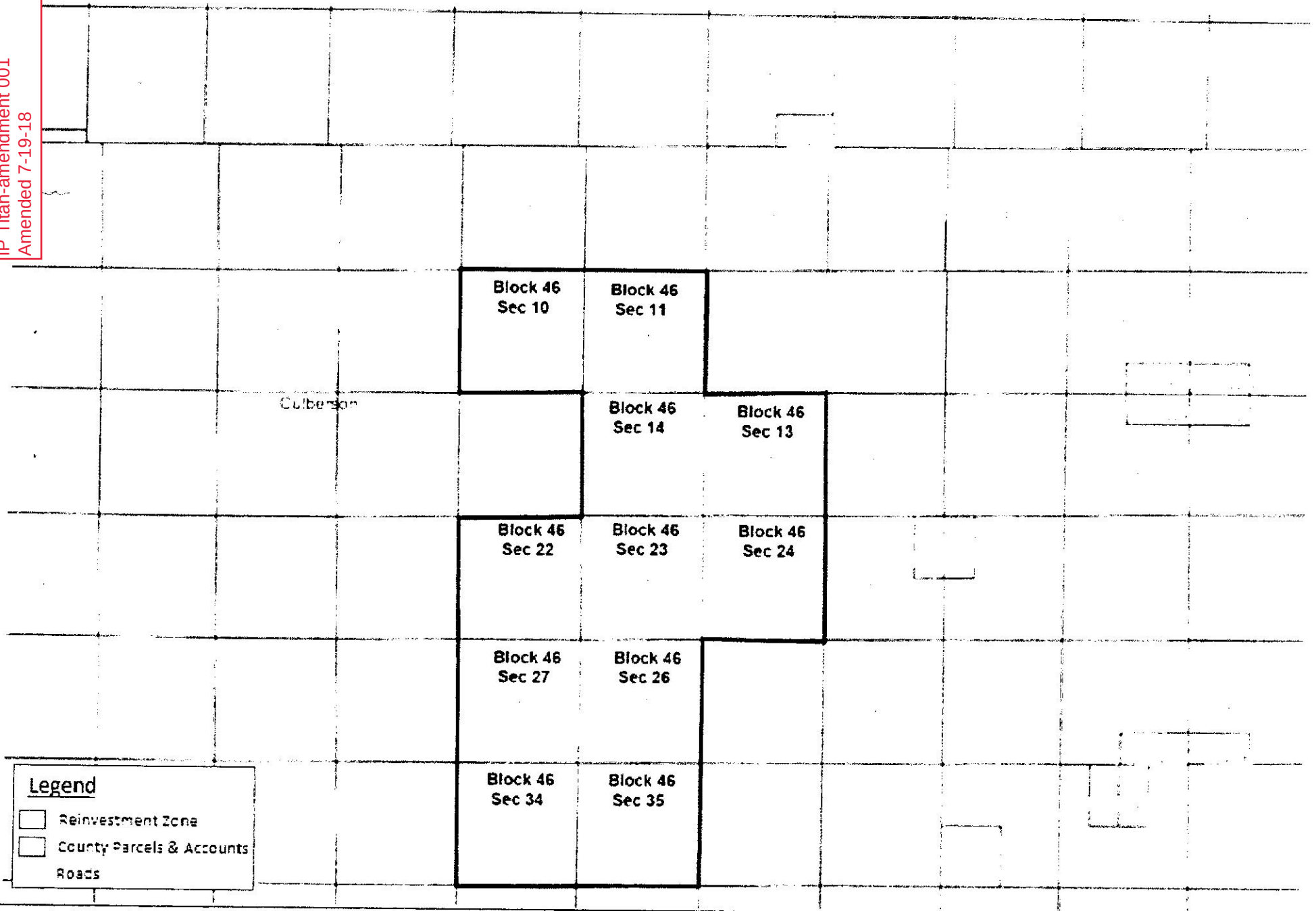
