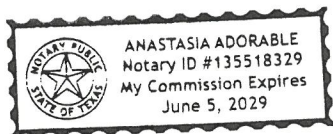

Dear Superintendent,

2W Permian Solar, LLC requests that the Andrews Independent School District's Board of Trustees waive the job requirement provision as allowed by Section 313.025(f-1) of the Tax Code. This waiver would be based on the school district's board findings that the jobs creation requirement exceeds the industry standard for the number of employees reasonably necessary for the operation of the facility of the property owner that is described in the application.

2W Permian Solar, LLC requests that the Board of Trustees make such a finding and waive the job creation requirement for 10 permanent jobs. Although the total number of employees assigned to the facility has remained consistent, only one position will meet the definition of a Qualified Job under the Agreement during the applicable compliance period. The remaining positions require highly specialized skills and training unique to the Company's proprietary processes. As a result, these roles must be filled through internal transfers of existing employees who already possess the required qualifications, rather than through external hiring. Because these positions do not represent newly created jobs and are filled by existing Company personnel, they do not qualify as Qualified Jobs under the Agreement. 2W Permian Solar, LLC, has committed to create one qualified job.
